AVI's mission is to promote health, dignity, and well-being for all people affected by HIV, HCV, and substance use by delivering sex-positive and harm reduction based education, prevention, and support services.

AVI envisions a community where all people affected by HIV, HCV, or substance use have equitable access to the support and services necessary to experience optimal health and well-being.

Westshore AVI's Health Centre offers low barrier, personcentred services that include substance use disorder care and OAT, primary care and nursing, support and referrals, harm reduction supplies and information, HCV treatment, and PrEP and STI testing and treatment.

(Also yummy snacks, bus tickets, dog cuddles, a book nook, stuff for kids to do, support and educational groups, raffles, a comfy couch and more...)






Why do we do what we do where we do it?

- Langford is the fastest growing community in Canada but the Westshore is severely lacking in healthcare services.
- We are the only OAT clinic in the 'hood.
- Folks can't/don't want to travel downtown for services.
- Substance use remains highly stigmatized.
- Most of our patients are in the highest risk group for overdose death.





Also: because access to health care is a human right And: fighting stigma and promoting dignity is our duty







Challenges include...

- ✓ patients missing appointments
- ✓ folks showing up late or on the wrong day/wrong time.
- ✓ people moving and/or changing phone numbers and/or pharmacies and
 forgetting to tell us
- ✓ patients not knowing or feeling uncomfortable to ask for health care not related to their OAT prescriptions
- ✓ there is a lack of services to refer people to in the Westshore and long waitlists everywhere on the Island
- ✓ pharmacies that are uncooperative/stigmatizing of our patients
- ✓ we are not open enough and our wait time for intake is way too long.
- ✓ it is hard to get the whole team together at the same time to work on these challenges





Strategies to minimize our challenges include:

- ✓ sending reminders about upcoming appointments via texts, phone calls or emails
- ✓ blocking extra time in the scheduler for walk-ins and urgent need
- ✓ offering a handout at intake that lists all of our services and how to access them (fancy welcome package coming soon...)
- ✓ questions being asked about testing, birth control, cancer screening, etc. at intake or soon after (as appropriate and comfortable)
- ✓ working with pharmacy owners and teams to streamline and support each others work
- ✓ using surveys to ask how we are doing and what people need from
 us





Looking forward...our hopes and dreams include....

(BIG)

The decriminalization of drugs, homes for all, an end to the overdose crisis, the restoration of human rights, increasing de-colonization...

Being part of a fulsome Community Health Centre that offers a whole range of wellness services in the Westshore...
