





## Summary

On September 15th, 2017, the Best-Practices in Oral Opioid agoniSt Therapy (BOOST) Collaborative was launched in partnership with the BC Centre for Excellence in HIV/AIDS and Vancouver Coastal Health. There were over 70 attendees from approximately 20 teams from across primary care, mental health, substance use and outreach services in Vancouver. On December 7th, for the second time teams came together for Learning Session 1 to share their progress to date, improve their understanding of quality improvement methodology, make new connections, and spend dedicated time working on their plans for Action Period 2.
